Finished Blocks for Quilt = 12" Square


Unfinished Blocks for Quilt = 12 1/2" Square

All seams a scant 1/4"
Press in the direction of the arrows

Block #3 - "Union Star" Quilt Block



The fabrics can get confusing because they run from lights to darks & everything in between. So here's the fabrics go into this quilt block & the numbers associated with them:



Cherry Bomb



Sugar Magnolia



Strawberry Fields



Raspberry Beret



Black









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Block #3 - Cutting Requirements for SIX (6) "Union Star" Quilt Blocks



"Union Star"
Quilt Block
Make a total of SIX (6)

	Sugar Magnolia - Color #11	Cut SIX (6) 4 1/2" squares.
	Sugar Magnolia - Color #11	Cut TWENTY-FOUR (24) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
þ	Cherry Bomb - Color #3	Cut TWELVE (12) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
	Raspberry Beret - Color #13	Cut THIRTY-SIX (36) 3" squares. On the back side of the squares draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time.
	Strawberry Fields - Color #12	Cut TWELVE (12) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
	Black - Color #6	Cut TWENTY-FOUR (24) 2 1/2" squares.
	Black - Color #6	Cut THIRTY-SIX (36) 3" squares. On the back side of the squares draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time.
	Black - Color #6	Cut NINETY-SIX (96) 2 1/2" squares. On the back side of the squares draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time.

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

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
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Block #3 - Piecing the "Union Star" Quilt Blocks Together



"Union Star" **Quilt Block** Make a total of SIX (6)

Half-Square Triangle (HST) Tutorial

Place the Raspberry Beret 3" square on the Black 3" square (right sides together) and sew 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the line you drew (shown in green in Figure #1). Then cut the halfsquare triangles apart ON the line you drew (shown in red in Figure #1).



Red line = Drawn line

Green dashed line = Sew 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the drawn line

You will end up with TWO (2) Half-Square Triangles (Figure #2). Press toward the darkest

Quilt Note: When making HST's, try cutting your squares 1/4" or 1/2" larger than the pattern calls for, then trim them down to 2 1/2" square. You need to make a total of SEVENTY-TWO (72) for all SIX (6) "Union Star" quilt blocks.

Flying Geese Tutorial

This is an alternate way to make a traditional Flying Geese. It's more like making Snowball Corners. You'll see in my "Cutting Instructions," to draw a line on the back side of some fabrics (shown in red in Figures #1 & #2), corner-to-corner.

The unfinished Flying Geese size's will be 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.

With right sides together, line up the smaller square so that it is perfectly even with the corner & sides of the rectangular piece. Then you'll sew, ON the line you drew & cut off the corner, 1/4" from the line you sewed (shown in green in Figure #2). Press toward the darkest color (Figure #3). You need to make a total of TWENTY-FOUR (24) for all SIX (6) "Union Square" quilt blocks.

Repeat this same process for the opposite corner. And repeat the entire process with the Red Hot Chili Pepper (Color #3) & the Black (Color #6) fabrics. You need to make a total of TWELVE (12) for all SIX (6) "Union Square" quilt blocks. Repeat the same process for Color #12 (Strawberry Fields & Color #6 (Black). You need to make TWELVE (12) of these, too!

This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) to see if you get the correct block


After you've sewn the Half-Square Triangles together & the Flying Geese together, these are just Nine-Patch quilt blocks!





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
