

We will again celebrate friendly competition with our annual display of member challenge quilts at our September 2017 Pot Luck meeting. We will move our meeting to Faith Presbyterian Church on 2nd & Cherokee Streets in Emmaus. Faith's Fellowship Hall has a much better venue to display our quilts.

Guidelines:

Create a quilt using at least two colors that are of true solid fabrics.

The quilt must measure 30" wide by 39" long.

Your quilt must be quilted.

A 3" hanging sleeve is helpful but not required.

Trip News

We had a wonderful time in Houston! Being on a "quilting trip high", I plunged right in to the possibilities for Paducah right away. I met with success.

The Paducah trip is a different style of trip in that it is one week in duration as it would be a bus trip. It requires two days to go and two days to return and three full days at the show.

This is the third trip I have planned to Paducah, BUT the first time that it will be for the September 13 to 16th, 2017, show. This is a NEW show, but it will be in Paducah. There will be some differences between the traditional April and the new September show.

We will be staying on Hinkleville Road at the Drury Inn (right next store to Hancock's of Paducah). We will travel with Perkiomen Tours. Perkiomen requires their buses to stop every two hours as closely as possible. We will plan other stops along the way to add interest and fun to our trip. Those details are not worked out, but hotel and bus are secure.

Costs will be available hopefully in mid January. ESTIMATED cost between \$1100 and \$1400. The deciding factor is the number going. I have been offered 24 rooms, 20 of which are double queens 4 which are king. Because this is a quilt week the room costs are more than for our trip to Houston. Plan on \$125 per night per person while in Paducah, the other two travel nights will be less. Some meals will be included and the Drury Inn offers both breakfast and kick back supper every night.

If you wish to go, send me a \$100 deposit ASAP to secure a spot. I will do a registration form after the holidays and get it back to you. For now it is important to commit to the trip. I hope to be at the January meeting to answer questions BUT you are always free to call or email me. I will hold this open for Crazy Quilters for a short time, then open it up to other guilds.

December 2016 Block – Twin Sisters

Our December 2016 block is known by many names - Twin Sisters, Pinwheel, Water Wheel, Whirlwind and Windmill. Give your block(s) to Kathie Laposata at either the November or December meeting. The winner will be drawn at the December meeting. You don't have to be present to win.


Block: Twin Sisters (8-1/2 by 8-1/2 inch finished size). You can make up to 10 blocks for more chances to win. Don't make two exactly alike.

Color theme: The person winning this month's quilt blocks will have the makings of a blue and white quilt.



Fabric requirements:

The blades can be any shade of blue, either a solid or a print that is primarily blue. The background should be white or white on white.



Blades – Four 7-1/2 by 3-1/2 inch rectangles.

Background – Two 4-1/2 x 4-1/2 inch squares that are cut on the diagonal to make 4 triangles.


Construction





Step 1 – Sew a background triangle onto the blue rectangle as shown in the first picture. Repeat for all four pairs of rectangles and triangles. Press the seam toward the blue

Step 2 – Arrange the units as shown in the second picture.

Step 3 – Sew pairs of units together and press the seam toward the blue.



Step 4 – Sew the block halves together, and again press the seam toward the blue. To do this you will need to ‘twirl the seam’ at the middle. If you’ve never tried this trick to create seams with less bulk, take a look at a tutorial at: <http://scrap-therapy-quilts.blogspot.com/2015/08/pop-twist-furl-twirl.html>



Step 5 – Trim the block so that it measures 9 inches square. The corners of your 9 inch square should line up with the seam lines. Since the edges of this block are on the bias, press carefully, and repress if needed to get the block square before trimming.
