Anyone Read a Good Book Lately?

After finishing the quilt journey, most of our members have another hobby of gardening and reading.

I would like to include book recommendations in the newsletter that members suggest. It does not have to be quilt related. Please email me with any suggestions.

Here are two suggestions from Sue Marin.

I have two books that I think would be of interest to our members. They are "The Secret Lives of Colour" and "The Golden Thread: How Fabric Changed History" both of which were written by Kassia St. Clair. Both of them are good tie-ins to Emily Taylor's lectures on the color theory and Michelle Banton's presentation on Cotton to Consumer respectively.

In "The Secret Lives of Colour" one can learn where certain pigments were first used and how certain colors got their names. Some of our favorites, such as "yellow" and its various hues, had subversive meanings.

"The Golden Thread" is packed with stories of why and when humans began making cloth, as well as the importance and wealth it represented. It also includes references to the tools used to create cloth. Ms. St. Clair states that the Bronze Age and Iron Age should be renamed, as the making of cloth was just as important, if not more so, than the metals.

Sue and I had the same book in mind. Although I did not get to read the colour theory book, I did watch a good video on the book. You can find the video on YouTube by searching for videos by Just Get it Done Quilts and Let's Talk About Colour with Kassia St. Clair – Karen's Quilt Circle.


