Quilt Challenge 2024

The challenge this year will be "Quilts in Movies/Literature". This can be an actual quilt seen in a movie or mentioned in a piece of literature or a quilt inspired by either of these. All entries should have a little write up that can be posted with their quilt telling what the inspiration was for the entry. Entries due by December 28th.

Four Categories:

Large (over 40x40)

Small (less than 40x40)

Other (garments, placemats, bags, etc.)

Original (items that were not created using a pattern created by someone other than the maker)

Tea Trivia

- 1. Tea was once used as money. Tea leaves were compressed into bricks and used as a form of currency.
- 2. English teacups did not have handles. They were originally fashioned after the handle-less cups used in China. It wasn't until the 19th century that handles appeared on teacups. The were inspired by the cups used for chocolate.
- 3. Iced tea got its kickstart in the USA around the 1870's. Recipes for flavored teas with honey and sugar became very popular. Iced tea was a great hit at the 1904 World's Fair in St. Louis.
- 4. Tea grows on trees! In 1991, a tree in the Yunnan Province of China measured 84' tall. It was estimated to be 2,700 years old.
- 5. Darjeeling tea is the most well-renowned and is often referred to the "Champaign of Teas".
- 6. Turkey drinks the most tea. Ireland is second; the UK is third.



- 7. Tea is the second most consumed beverage in the world. Water is #1.
- 8. All tea comes from the same plant. What makes the different types is how it is processed.
- 9. According to the Tea Association of the United States of America, 84% of the tea consumed in America is black tea. Of that amount, 75% 85% is served as iced tea.
